**Year 6 Residential to Petty Pool**  
**Monday 12<sup>th</sup> to Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> May 2025**



We have reserved places for a Year 6 residential to Petty Pool Outdoor Centre in Cheshire. You may remember that the children visited Petty Pool in Year 5 as part of a day trip but we have been offered the opportunity to have a residential there.

A residential at the centre offers the opportunity to do different activities to the day package. Firstly, unlike some previous Year 6 residentials, we will have sole occupancy of the centre which will allow the children to relax in their surroundings and our school staff will be able to tailor evening timings and events to suit our group. Secondly, there are a number of different activities that will be available which were not possible during our day visit. We are currently putting together the programme of activities for the children and will be able to give more details at the parents' information meeting after Christmas.

The centre offers dormitory accommodation in a variety of room sizes (from 4-6) and during their stay all pupils will have the opportunity to take part in a huge variety of activities. The visit will also give the children the opportunity of developing their personal and social skills.

All the staff at the centre are suitably qualified to instruct the various activities and all specialist equipment is provided by the centre. At the moment we are finalising some pricing, but it is anticipated that the total cost of the residential will be around £260. This will include the cost of all travel, meals, insurances, accommodation, all activities and the use of the facilities. We would like all children to attend the residential as we believe it forms an important part of their social development and will also develop skills in numerous areas including Outdoor Adventurous Activities, which is part of the P.E. curriculum.

To enable your child to attend the residential trip, we would be grateful if you could complete and return the attached consent form below and make the necessary arrangements to pay the £25.00 holding deposit no later than **Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2024**.

More details will be sent out when available and a meeting regarding this visit will be held after Christmas for parents and children to find out more about the trip.

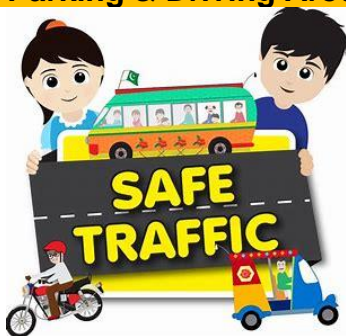
## Safeguarding

## Parking & Driving Around School



To help keep all members of our school community and our wider community safe please remember not to park on the zig-zag lines outside school when dropping off or picking up children and to aid visibility please avoid parking on the road directly outside school. We would also ask any parents using Warwick Drive to be extra careful and aware of pedestrians using this route to access school.

It would also be much appreciated if parents consider the through traffic along Caldy Road and avoid attempting U-turns in the road. These sorts of manoeuvres in the road can be particularly dangerous for all road users and pedestrians during these busy times of day.

## Scooters and Bicycles



It is lovely to see children coming to school on their bicycles and scooters in the morning. However please could we ask that bicycles and scooters are not left on the school ground during the day for safety reasons.

## Earrings in School



It has come to our attention that there are a number of children wearing earrings in school. Our uniform policy states that for health and safety reasons no jewellery with the exception of a watch may be worn in school.

Therefore, we would be grateful if you could remind children to remove earrings and any other jewellery before coming to school.

We understand that a number of children have only recently had their ears pierced and although it is not ideal, in this instance could we ask parents/carers to ensure that earrings are covered each morning with plasters.

Once the 6-week healing process is complete the earrings should be removed and not worn during school time.

## Start of the Day Arrangements



Before school club is from 7.45am to 8.30am. Children attending before school club should enter the hall via the main school glass entrance doors.

From 8.30am to 8.45am parents may drop children off at the school gate which will be manned by Avalon staff. Alternatively parents and carers who may wish to bring their child onto the school site and drop their child off at the allocated entrance doors.

For Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, this will be at the main glass entrance doors. For all Junior children, Year 3 to Year 6, this will be at the front door of the junior building.

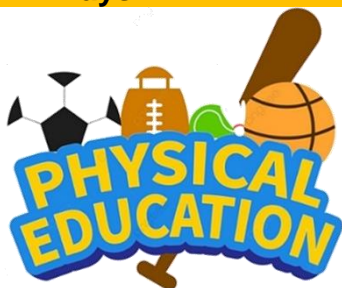
