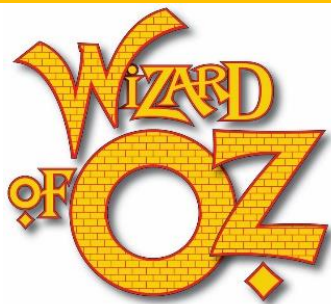

We will be asking all the children to donate root vegetables for school council to take on the day. The school council will be helping muck out and feed the animals during their visit. They will also help to build a bug house and set up some mini habitats in the wildlife area using sticks and rocks. There may even be time to make some bird feeders too.

Eco Council will be leaving school after an early lunch at around 12.30pm and will back at school at 3.30pm. As we are visiting the farm in June, it is important that all children wear a sunhat and come to school with sunscreen already applied. Please can we also ask that the children come to school in full school uniform and bring old clothes, including wellies in a separate bag. The children can also bring with them a small water bottle.

Children will be transported to the farm using staff vehicles, if your child requires a booster car seat then can this please be brought into school on the day of the trip.

We understand that a number of children have only recently had their ears pierced and although it is not ideal, in this instance could we ask parents/carers to ensure that earrings are covered each morning with plasters.

Once the 6-week healing process is complete the earrings should be removed and not worn during school time.

Start of the Day Arrangements



Before school club is from 7.45am to 8.30am. Children attending before school club should enter the hall via the main school glass entrance doors.

From 8.30am to 8.45am parents may drop children off at the school gate which will be manned by Avalon staff. Alternatively parents and carers who may wish to bring their child onto the school site and drop their child off at the allocated entrance doors.

For Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, this will be at the main glass entrance doors. For all Junior children, Year 3 to Year 6, this will be at the front door of the junior building.

Arriving late to School



Late attendance (after 8.45am). If your child is late coming into school, we then ask that parents ring the intercom for assistance and bring their child directly into the school office for registrations.

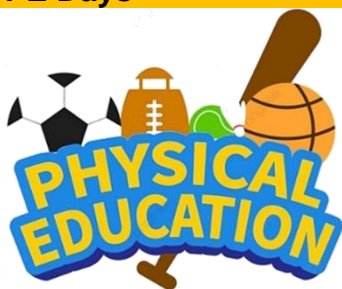
